Nursery Rhyme Composition (10 points)

Names

1. Create an A section by accompanying a nursery rhyme with a bordun.

a. Choose a nursery rhyme from the reverse side of this paper.

b. Perform a **bordun** with the rhyme for the A section. Borduns will be performed on barred instruments.


1. Play your bordun on every beat of the nursery rhyme.

2. For your bordun, you may use C and G, OR D and A, or E and B, or F and C, or G and D, or A and E. <u>Do not</u> use B and F.

2. Create new words for a B section.

Write new words that have rhyme and repetition. Your new text should complement the text of the nursery rhyme. Two or four lines of text are acceptable.

SAMPLE B SECTION: One, two, three, four! Give me plenty more! Five, six, seven, eight! You can watch me clean my plate!

3. Accompany the B section words (from step 2) with a rhythmic ostinato (repeated pattern).

You may be original, or you can choose some text from either the nursery rhyme or your created B text that is rhythmically interesting. When you repeat that text, you will have an ostinato!

The ostinato should be 4 beats long, and <u>repeat throughout</u> your B section.

You will use UPP (unpitched percussion instruments) to play the ostinato.

4. Perform the nursery rhyme arrangement as an ABA form piece for our class.

- A: Nursery rhyme + bordun on barred instrument
- B: New words + ostinato on UPP
- A: Nursery rhyme + bordun on barred instrument

You may continue the bordun throughout the B section if you wish, but it **must** be played during A sections.

Nursery Rhymes from which to choose:

Old Mother Hubbard

Little Jack Horner

Little Jack Horner sat in the corner Eating his Christmas pie. He stuck in his thumb, and pulled out a plum, And said "What a good boy am I!"

Little Boy Blue

Little Boy Blue, come blow your horn. The sheep's in the meadow! The cow's in the corn! Where is the boy who looks after the sheep? He's under a haystack fast asleep.

Little Miss Muffet

Little Miss Muffet sat on a tuffet Eating her curds and whey. Along came a spider, who sat down beside her, And frightened Miss Muffet away.

Hey Diddle Diddle

Hey diddle diddle the cat and the fiddle, The cow jumped over the moon. The little dog laughed to see such a sport, And the dish ran away with the spoon.

Hunpty Dumpty

Humpty Dumpty sat on a wall. Humpty Dumpty had a great fall. All the king's horses and all the king's men Couldn't put Humpty together again.

Jack and Jill

This assignment is worth 10 points, assigned as follows: Choose a nursery rhyme (1 point) Write a new text (1 point) that rhymes (1 point) and complements the nursery rhyme (1 point) Write an ostinato (1 point) that complements the nursery rhyme (1 point) Choose a UPP instrument that clearly plays the rhythm of your ostinato (1 point) Play your arrangement in ABA form for the class (3 points)
